

Girls Gone Vinyl Female DJ Collective Celebrates 10 years at Movement Festival



On May 28, 2016, from 11 am to 8 pm at A Mix Bricktown in Detroit, Girls Gone Vinyl will celebrate 10 years with an anniversary party and fundraiser to benefit a young female artist. Girls Gone Vinyl is an all-female DJ collective founded by and promoter Maggie Derthick of Auxetic and years later joined by . The collective seeks to empower female artists in the male-dominated electronic music industry and provide an opportunity for female DJs and other music insiders to connect. Movement Festival forms an integral part of the history of Girls Gone Vinyl as the collective originated as all-female DJ night organized by Maggie Derthick each year since 2006. Over the years, Girls Gone Vinyl has expanded to include a documentary project of the same name, now in the final stages of production with a release expected in 2016. Last year's fundraiser raised enough money to send one young artist to Sessions 1 and 2 at Music Industry Academy. Jada Tabbs debuts as DJ007 at this year's event. Tickets for the anniversary party are \$10, and proceeds will again provide a scholarship for a young artist to enroll at Music Industry Academy.
