Qasim Basir is the director of the film that stars Omari Hardwick, Megan Good, Jay Ellis and Kenya Barris. The story is a romantic drama that takes place during the 2016 election night and it will be featured in the NEXT category films that an "innovative, forward-thinking approach to storytelling."
