Emanuel Honors Black Women With Video

Singer-songwriter Emanuel posts the Jamar Harding-directed video for "Black Woman." The video begins with a quote from Nikki Giovanni in her 1971 conversation with James Baldwin about Black women's expectations from Black men. Emanuel sings from the stage and sits in a chair as various Black women are pictured. The R&B singer shared his feelings about the sentiment in a statement:

"'Black Womanâ \in " is about reconciliation and also celebration — celebrating how strong our women are and how they hold us up. People might think this song was written as a response to the moment right now but it's saying the exact same thing it was saying when it was written a year ago — 'I see you, I recognize you, I appreciate you and I love you."Â
