The attendees had a pre-show celebration in a room decorated in purple and they honored Prince's contributions to music and pop culture and his lasting influence. The Roots' co-founder and drummer Questlove, who also got to share the stage with Prince, was snapped with Anna Fantastic, who inspired "Pink Cashmere" and "Lemon Crush."
