

Pink Siifu Shares WHOUWITHHO+ Feat. Kal Banx

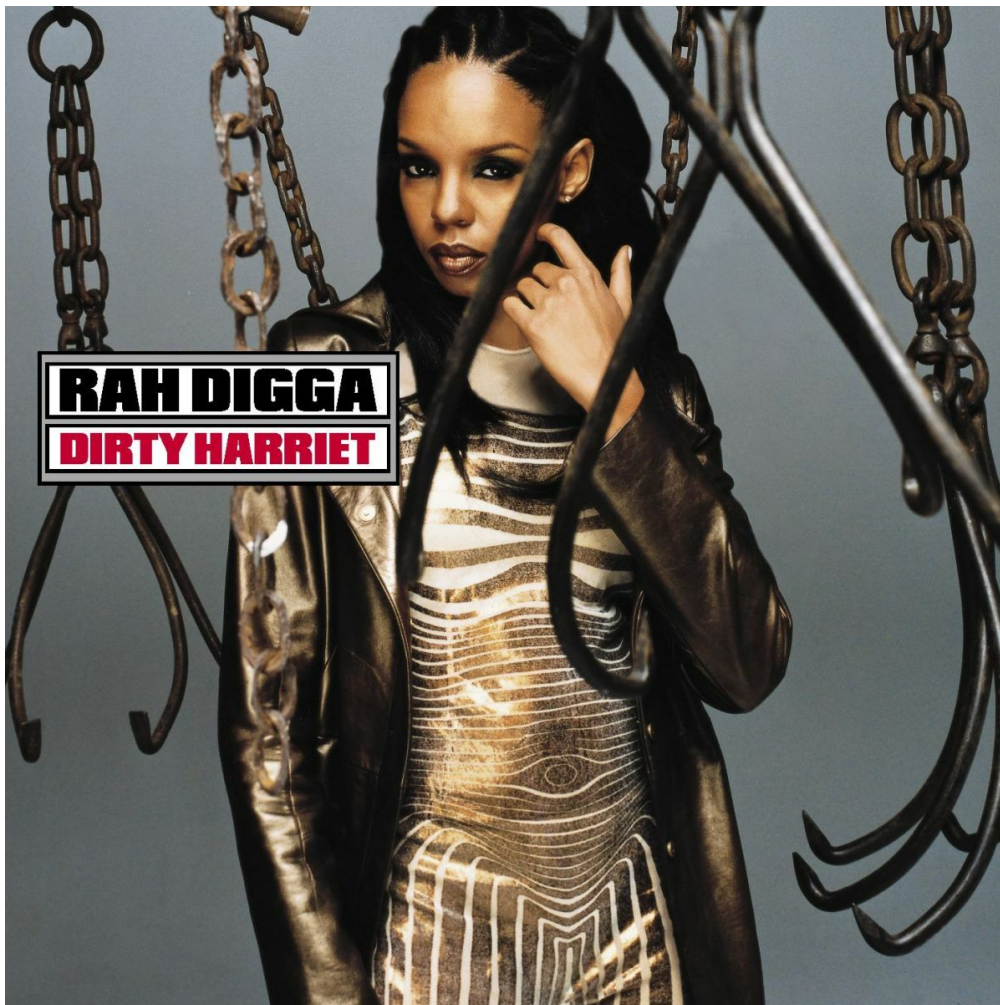


Pink Siifu announces his fourth album, *BLACK'ANTIQUE* and shares "WHOUWITHHO+" featuring Kal Banx. Siifu raps in his usual snappy but almost whispery flow over Banx' rotating trap

drums. "WHOUWITHH0+" is the second single to emerge from the next album following "SCREW4LIFE!RIPJALEN'!" Siifu embraces his singular style even harder on BLACK'ANTIQUE and explained that approach in a press release: "This album was made with the intent to sharpen and truly show that an artist should be one of one. This album is the shit eye say to myself in the mirror. We get each album/project to tell a different side of ourselves, bring you into a world, speak on our existence, and express ourselves in depth. Everything present and in front of you isn't here to stay, but the memory and the stories will forever be something. That's an antique'! Something or Someone Who is Here to Stay'! A Source of Inspiration, Power, and Something Timeless'!"

Siifu's third solo album, *GUMBO!* came out in 2022, and since then he has had collaborative albums including *Real Bad Flights* with producer Real Bad Man, *Leather Blvd.* with Ahwlee, and *It's Too Quiet..'*! with Turich Benjy. *BLACK 'ANTIQUE* will be released on January 27th.

**Throwback: Rah Digga Feat.
Busta Rhymes: Imperial**



Rah Digga's "Imperial" is from her 2000 solo debut album, *Dirty Harriet*, and one of her collaborations with Busta Rhymes. Powered by Shok of Ruff Ryder's production, Digga and Rhymes showed their skills over video game signals and tumbling drums. Digga's raspy flow eliminated any sexist questions about her holding the microphone when she said, "Black chick, with intellect, who want to match wits? Write my own rhymes so can't no n**** tell me jack s***." She declared her space as a bona fide rhymer of the New Jersey canon that includes Lauryn Hill and Queen Latifah. *Dirty Harriet* gave Digga immediate respect in the rap world, and "Imperial" revealed undeniable musical chemistry with Rhymes, who recruited her for his Flipmode Squad after she was introduced to him by Q-Tip. Rah Digga released her sophomore album, *Classic*, in 2010. She currently co-hosts the podcast *Yanadameen* with Lord Jamar.

Sa-Roc Has Amazing Grace

Never shrink to make others comfortable. Accept affirming words from others with a thank you, full stop. No more shying away from our greatness but settling into it comfortably and confidently."
